## **INDUSTRIAL ACTION – 27<sup>th</sup> April and 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2023**

### **Industrial Action by the National Education Union (NEU)**

As you are aware, the National Education Union (NEU) has provided formal confirmation that there will be further days of industrial action on 27<sup>th</sup> April and 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2023. I am writing to advise you of the arrangements for these days.

I have been advised that we have more than 70% of teachers who are members of the NEU and may decide to take strike action on these days. The union does not have to provide the names of individual members to the school. Individual NEU members do not have to tell us which union they are a member of, or whether they personally intend to take part in strike action. I have been advised that those members of the NEU deciding to take industrial action will not be attending the workplace, planning, and preparing lessons, marking student work, responding to emails, or carrying out any other duties that would normally be a part of their working day.

Whilst it is the Department for Education's expectation that school leaders will take all reasonable steps to keep schools open fully, I must be sure that the health and safety of pupils and staff can be sufficiently guaranteed without a full complement of staff. I am not able to give this surety to parents and governors. Our experience of the last strike days confirmed that the decision to partially close the school to students was the correct one. As I believe there is again no option but to restrict attendance, in consultation with senior colleagues and the governing body, I have decided that **school will close on both dates, to all students in year 9, other than those who are vulnerable, as identified prior to the last strike day.**

We are extremely sorry to have had to make this decision and thank you for your understanding.

All work set will be accessed through Microsoft Teams. Teachers striking do not have to set work on the day of the strike. Due to this reason, I have arranged a Ms Team called LS Whole School. In this team there is a channel on the left for Year 9:

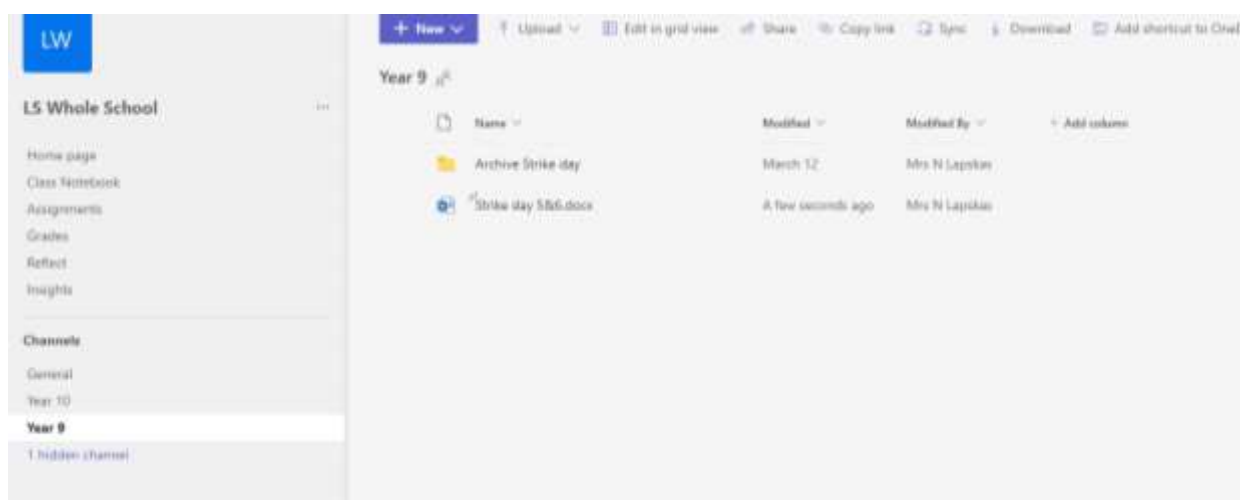


On the day, if your child's lesson is there, then this is their priority.
